LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear members. I'd like to bring you up-to-date on a few things that the Museum is involved in.

Gowen Field Memorial:

The ground-breaking ceremony for the Gowen Field Memorial is scheduled for Friday, May 23, 2008, at a time to be announced. Major General Lafrenz' staff is working with Governor Otter's staff to coordinate his participation in the ceremony.

The memorial will pay tribute to all Idahoans from all branches of service who have served our country.

IMHS members are cordially invited to attend this event. The memorial site is located in the northeast corner of the Farman Street and Guard Street intersection directly east of the IDNG headquarters building. For those of you who are familiar with Gowen Field, it will stand where the ARNG's Medical Clinic used to be. More information will be e-mailed as it becomes available.

IMHS Building Information:

The IMHS Board of Governors is working with Mr. John Norris, Legislative Assistant/Executive Officer to MG Lafrenz, to plan and design a new building for the IMHS Museum. A long range plan identifies the need for additional exhibit and storage space to accommodate current artifacts and future acquisitions. The current Museum building will be retained; however, it is not easily expandable.

The Army Guard Facility Engineer's Office will be designing a 40,000 square foot, hanger-type building that will be eventually located directly north of our current building. This will provide adequate space to develop diorama-based exhibits that are more interactive, and more closely follow the Army Museum System's guidelines for exhibits.

Mr. Norris wants to submit the plan for MG Lafrenz' approval, and have the proposal ready to brief the Idaho Legislature's Joint Finance & Appropriations Committee (JFAC) in October. This is a significant step forward in the maturity of the Society and Museum. We will keep you posted on the development of this exciting project.

Memorial Day Ceremony, Idaho State Veterans Cemetery:

I would also like to extend an invitation to all of you to attend the Memorial Day Ceremony at the Idaho State Veterans Cemetery on Monday, May 26, 2008. The IMHS and the Idaho Civil War Volunteers will be manning a composite artillery saluting battery to fire the 21-gun salute just prior to raising the national colors to full staff at high noon.

The battery consists of two Civil War Napoleon Cannons and two WWII

75mm Pack Howitzers. This will be the third year that the battery has participated in the Memorial Day Ceremony. Please join us in honoring our fallen Veterans.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank each and every one of you for all your efforts on behalf of the Society and Museum. They are greatly appreciated!

IDAHO HISTORY DAY 2008

History Day is a national program and is one of the premier academic enrichment programs in the nation. In Idaho, students in grades 4-12 work hard all year to develop research papers, exhibits, performances, documentation, and websites. They then enter them in a series of contests which will, if they win, lead them to the state competition. Winners of the state competition in each category and age group will qualify for the national contest in Washington D.C.

Your Idaho Military Historical Society supports this educational program by providing incentives and recognition to persons who participate in the Senior Exhibits Section of the program.

At the state contest, the senior exhibitors with military subjects are judged by members of the Idaho Military Historical Society and receive awards separate from the overall state awards. The exhibitors are judged on the significance of the selected subject, historical accuracy, clarity, written neatness and overall appearance.

The person or team judged to have presented the best exhibit pertaining to a military subject is recognized with a certificate, a one year membership in the IMHS, an Idaho National Guard History book, and a check for \$100. These awards encourage students to study and select topics which pertain to military history.

This year the State History Day Contest will be held on the 11th of April at the College of Idaho in Caldwell. The theme is "Conflict and Compromise in History." Over 600 contestants are expected to participate.

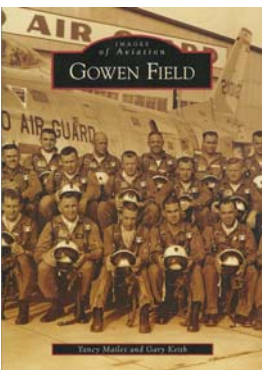

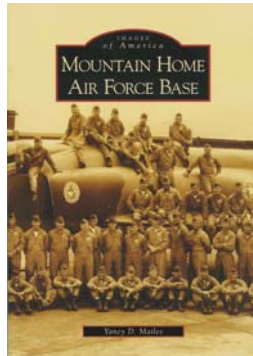


Images of Aviation; Gowen Field

IN MEMORIAM



It is with deep regret that we inform you of the passing of one of our members, Arthur B. Cozine.

Not only was Art an active member, he also trained at Gowen Field in 1942 and became a very

proficient B-17 bombardier. He went on to fly 50 missions during WWII. His unit was the 347th Squadron, part of the 99th Bomb Group. The Group earned a Presidential Unit Citation; Art himself earned an Air Medal.

Our deepest sympathies go out to the Cozine family; Mr. Cozine will be greatly missed. In 1999, Art compiled his memoirs, *My Story, 1941-1945*. His family has graciously donated a copy to the Museum. ☆

DID YOU KNOW... that during WWII, Mexican Air Force pilots trained at the Pocatello Army Air Base?

On August 6, 1944, the ground echelon of the 201st Mexican Fighter Squadron arrived at Pocatello.

The Squadron was there until November 27th when they departed by train to Greenville, Texas. One of the primary reasons for the transfer to Texas was that the weather was proving non-conducive to their flight training.¹

IDAHO FILE INTO HISTORY

THE IMHS SALUTES WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH!



**LENORE COTTRELL JOHNSTON
WWII VETERAN**

Lenore Cottrell was born to Theodore and Rebecca Cottrell in Stockton, California on May 24, 1920. She grew up there and attended first through eighth grade at Jefferson Jr. High School and High School at Stockton High. She was active in athletics playing baseball, basketball and even roller-skating. She then enrolled in the College of the Pacific, now the University of Pacific, and received a scholarship in her Junior year. On December 7, 1941, she was a senior at the College.

Lenore became interested in history in high school thanks to her history teacher, Mr. Rogers. He would bring in war plans from WWI and the students would reenact them. They even went to the nearby armory and learned how to shoot! When she enrolled in the College of the Pacific, she had a keen interest in history and political science.

After Pearl Harbor, she volunteered with the Red Cross which was near her Stockton home. She joined the air watch and underwent three days of training in aircraft recognition near San Francisco. Lenore was only asked to work in that field for three days while in Stockton but she became involved in many other Red

Cross activities. She learned first aid and became very adept at immediate care, bandaging injuries and loading ambulances.

Simultaneously, she volunteered with the Red Cross and finished her senior year in college. She then became a teacher to a seventh grade class in Avenal, California, where she taught for a year and a half. Patriotism was very high and her class sold more war bonds than any other class in the school. For that, they earned a ride in a military jeep around the school!

While living in Avenal, Lenore was still active with the Red Cross and even learned how to send Morse code radio messages. Avenal was an oil community and she learned that it was number five on the list of Japanese targets.

While in Avenal, she renewed her volunteer efforts with the air watch and became a regular watcher. *"I volunteered as an air watch warden on Saturdays."* Her station was *"on top of a high hill in Kettleman Hills."* *"I would pray to God that no enemy planes would come by."* She added, *"Fortunately, nothing strange ever took place during my watch."*

In 1944, Lenore joined the WAVES, Women Accepted for Voluntary Emergency Service (US Navy Women's Reserve)², ...against her family's wishes. She trained at Hunter College in New York and learned how to be a storekeeper which strange as it sounds today, included financial matters.

From the time Lenore started her training at Hunter College, a key point was stressed again and again; don't tell anyone where a ship or a sailor might be headed! After the war, and even today, the phrase "Loose lips sink ships" remains in the American vocabulary.

She attended her advanced training at Milledgeville, Georgia. It was in Georgia that she first became aware of the extent of racial discrimination. She often *“used the wrong door...intentionally!”* She also made friends with some ladies she still keeps in touch with.

Rumors about women in the military were rampant and cruel. One of the rumors we can mention here was that the WAVES were *“high class prostitutes for the officers.”* Her recruiting officer told them that the rumor was *“Russian propaganda.”* *“The rumor about women and officers was never printed, however, we were asked, and there were times if you didn’t accept a date you were asked this.”*

Whenever she went to the USO, the servicemen clustered around the civilian women but the WAVES did have their share of attention. Some of them went on dates, other visited and shared stories and listened to the service men. Many of the WWI veterans took a strong interest in the WAVES though!

There was a great deal of satisfaction in being in uniform. *“Every single one of us, we felt so proud, we just felt we were doing everything for our country. And we all looked good.”*³

Lenore was stationed at the U.S. Naval Hospital in Portsmouth, Virginia and was assigned to the finance department. On payday, escorted by a Marine in a Marine car, she paid the hospital patients...in cash!

She also recalls her captain making sure that they stayed active and friendly rivalry often resulted in game competition with the WACS, usually basketball and softball. *“The WACS were taller than we were; we never won when we played against them.”* She even found time to be on the Marching Drill Team for which she earned an award.

“This was a fun time and were we ever clean! The last one out of the dorm really checked. We always passed inspection!”

Lenore served in the WAVES for 17 months, by now, the war was over and she was sent to Camp Shoemaker, California for discharge.

She then returned to Stockton and caught the eye of a young man by the name of Tom Johnston. They married in 1946. They had two children, Becky and Tom, Jr., and in 1960, the family moved to Idaho.

She may be retired but that’s an oxymoron! She is active in Meals on Wheels, the Canyon

County Organization on Aging, Friends of the Library, Friends of the Depot, TRIAD (Senior volunteers to police), the Canyon County Historical Society, the woman’s association in her church and 4H. She is also an active member of the IMHS which she joined in 1996 and her interest in political science manifests itself in her activities in the political process. She’s a very busy lady and noted, *“I’m very fortunate that my family lives between Caldwell and Middleton!”*
